Position Summary:

The primary role of the Communications and Outreach Intern will be to provide community outreach and marketing support to the Advancement and Angel Oak Preserve department at Lowcountry Land Trust. This internship will provide hands-on experience with how a local nonprofit approaches data analysis, communications campaigns, and relationship-building to advance the work of the organization.

Responsibilities:

- Assists with creating event campaign strategies, sourcing imagery, and writing compelling copy to communicate with target audiences effectively;
- Conducts research and analyzes data to provide insights for outreach and communications efforts;
- Catalogs and categorizes educational and historical content to share with audiences;
- Establishes relationships with conservation-minded businesses, individuals, nonprofits, and special events to conduct outreach on behalf of the organization; and
- Other tasks as assigned.

Qualifications:

- Degree-seeking student at a college or university;
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills;
- Strong organizational skills; and
- Professional and relationship-oriented.

Compensation:

The Intern will have the opportunity to work up to 20 hours per week at a rate of \$15/ hr (maximum 200 hours).
